VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: APRIL SEO

VLSC FAMILY LAW DAY OF COURT (FLDOC) VOLUNTEER

April is a regular volunteer at our Family Law Day of Court.

Why do you volunteer with VLSC?

I have volunteered with VLSC from about 6 months after I obtained my license. VLSC provided me with valuable training as a young attorney. I feel that it is our privilege and responsibility to continue to give back to the courts as well as those litigants who cannot afford to obtain private legal representation.

What other community activities are you involved in?

I am a volunteer attorney with Tri-Valley Haven for Women (domestic violence clinic), a member of the Earl Warren American Inns of Court and am honored to have recently joined the board of the Alameda County Family Law Association (ACFLA).

What is one thing that you wished our donors/supporters knew about VLSC?

I think that it is critical for VLSC to support the efforts of Family Law Facilitator (FLF) and Self-Help as well as the judicial officers in providing volunteer assistance with the self-help calendar. Having come from a background with the Facilitator's office in my career, the coordination of volunteers and ongoing, consistent support is mission critical.

Do you have a particularly memorable volunteer experience or VLSC client?

Working with two self-represented litigants to reach an out of court settlement is particularly rewarding. It's not always about the law or who is right/wrong. It is when you can hone in on what's important, usually the children, that the parties who may have been quite contentious are able to reach a mutual agreement. This is one of the most rewarding aspects of volunteering, making that little bit of difference in someone's life or assisting parties in improving their co-parenting relationship so that people can move forward from the conflict.

How does having the opportunity to work with an attorney help the clients/litigants?

I think this provides an immense difference. Litigants who otherwise would not have access to an attorney sometimes just need someone to explain the process or procedure. Family court can be quite confusing and intimidating to navigate without assistance. FLF and Self-Help provide a critical service but often are limited in how many people they can realistically assist per day. It's important that the volunteer attorneys are present at the time of hearing and can explain the court orders if there is any confusion in the litigant's understanding of the orders or their obligations, etc.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: MELISSA TUNG

VLSC FAMILY LAW DAY OF COURT (FLDOC) VOLUNTEER

Melissa is a regular volunteer at our Family Law Day of Court.

Why do you volunteer with VLSC?

I enjoy working with the community and providing assistance to litigants who are often confused by the court system. I started my family law career as a law clerk for the San Mateo County's Family Law Facilitator's Office where I assisted self-represented litigants all day. I enjoyed hearing about their family law issues and providing them with a method to effectuate their goals.

It is rewarding for me to see a litigant learn about the system and they are often so thankful just to have a few seconds of an attorney's time. It makes all the time and effort worth it to see someone leave a hearing feeling heard by the Judge.

Volunteering with VLSC also allows me to get to know the Judges and clerks better. Each department is a little different so it's helpful to get some one-on-one time with the Court.

What other community activities are you involved in?

I am a member of the Family Law Section and Barrister's Section of the Alameda County Bar Association and Contra Costa County Bar Association.

Do you have a particularly memorable volunteer experience or VLSC client?

Helping a woman understand the family court process and assist her in finalizing her Judgment after years of being inactive because she did not understand the next step. She was so thankful to see that there was light at the end of the tunnel.

How does having the opportunity to work with an attorney help the clients/litigants?

I believe it is so beneficial for self-represented litigants to have the opportunity to speak with an attorney. Often times they do not understand what exactly is going on or how to move the case forward. Self-represented litigants are able to ask attorneys questions before orders are made. They can also obtain information to help them understand their options. It is helpful for litigants to be able to appear at their hearings with some quidance.

CLASP - Free drop-in legal clinic: Open to all



February 4th marked the launch of VLSC's new Community Legal Assistance Saturday Program (CLASP), a drop in legal clinic in Oakland held on the 1st Saturday of every month. Doors are open to the public

from 10:30 a.m. -12:00 p.m. The clinic provides brief free legal consultation, advice, and referral services to address individuals' legal questions regardless of residence income. It is most helpful to clients who need an initial consultation, some brief assistance, or don't fit the criteria for other legal services assistance.



CLASP Volunteers

Since February, volunteer attorneys with experience in a wide spectrum of areas of law, including family, criminal, immigration, housing, employment, consumer, personal injury, probate, and real estate have assisted

over 100 clients. The clinic's success relies heavily on the committed volunteers that dedicate their Saturday mornings each month. This includes not only attorneys, but also interpreters, law school students,

paralegals, and social workers who volunteer to provide clients with the most seamless assistance possible.
